3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Monitor, operate and control production plants
- Carry out quality assurance measures and maintain operating equipment
- Organise the supply of the basic materials of cement/lime, sand and gravel and of additives, reagents and water as and when required
- Comply with mixing instructions in arranging for and monitoring the weighing of solid components, the loading of the mixer, the addition of water and reagents and the mixing process
- Monitor the loading of mixing vehicles with wet concrete or wet mortar and the computer-aided production of delivery notes
- Carry out checks on concrete as and when required and in accordance with technical standards within the scope of autonomous monitoring activities undertaken
- Conduct regular checks of the conveying, weighing and mixing equipment and replace worn plant components as and when required
- Commission recycling plants for residual concrete and mortar and carry out maintenance operations

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (1)

Process mechanics in the non-metallic minerals industry specialising in ready-mixed concrete mainly work in materials manufacturing plants such as concrete works. They are also employed by companies working in the concrete and reinforced concrete construction branch or by recycling plants processing residual concrete.

<p>Final examination administered by the competent body:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. after completion of dual training in a company and at part-time vocational school (normal procedure) 2. after retraining in a recognized training occupation 3. as an external examination for working people without formal vocational qualifications or persons who have been trained at full-time vocational schools or other vocational training institutions
<p>Additional information</p> <p>Entry requirements: Entry requirements are not governed by legislation; as a rule, young people are admitted after completing (nine or ten years of) general education.</p> <p>Duration of training: 3 years.</p> <p>Training in the "dual system": Teaching of the knowledge, skills and competences needed for an occupation is based on the typical requirements of work and business processes and prepares the trainees for a specific job. The training is provided in a company and at part-time vocational school: In the company, the trainees acquire practical skills in a real working environment.
