This paper presents the findings of a BIBB research project in which trainees and educational specialists were surveyed as to their expectations of what constitutes good training and were also invited to assess current training reality.

The present paper assesses the new AEVO and the skeleton curriculum against the background of changed requirements within training practice.

Securing and further development of training quality at higher technical teaching institutes in Austria

The securing and further development of vocational education and training quality mainly affect the achievement of the objectives of a course of training in circumstances where prevailing general conditions are changing. The training provided at higher technical teaching institutes enjoys a high degree of acceptance amongst the general population and employers. The main problem from a medium-term point of view is the transparent representation at a European level of qualifications awarded, the fact being that most countries do not provide for the acquisition of higher vocational qualifications until post-secondary level. This paper presents the results of a relevant research project on the quality of training provided at higher technical teaching institutes (HTL) in Austria.

Migrants whose vocational qualifications are not accorded appropriate recognition in Germany experience considerable difficulties in obtaining employment commensurate with their qualification on the German labour market. For this reason, they require clear regulations on the investigation of possible recognition or partial recognition of vocational qualifications acquired in their respective home country and provision for the targeted adaptation of existing knowledge and skills. This paper presents an example from North Rhine-Westphalia, which shows how targeted training measures can prepare teaching staff from the states of the former Soviet Union for work activities within the occupation in which they are qualified.

The present paper takes an explorative study as the basis for conducting a survey of advanced training provision which casts an exemplary focus on teaching staff at vocational schools and relates this to the topics of the provision of support to disadvantaged young people and of the transition from school to the world of work.
