3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Explain and justify arboricultural measures, provide advice
- Record tree damage, identify causes of damage, assess tree remediation need and possibilities and calculate costs
- Prepare and set up work sites, plan the use of material, machines and equipment needed for tree maintenance and remediation
- Organize work processes and assign tasks to staff
- Conduct the necessary measures to ensure occupational safety and health, accident prevention and traffic safety
- Perform maintenance and remediation work on trees and in their immediate vicinity
- Manage work sites taking commercial and operational aspects into account

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Certified European tree technicians work in gardening and landscaping companies, open space authorities, forestry or farming enterprises or in wine-growing or are self-employed. They maintain and remediate tree stocks, plan the requisite labour and material, calculate costs, advise customers and provide expert assessments.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE
<p>The certificate is acquired by passing the examination administered by the body mentioned in section 5 above. Before sitting the examination, candidates must furnish proof of</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Successful completion of training for the recognized occupations of gardener, forest manager, wine-grower or farmer plus at least three years of work experience acquired in tree nurseries, gardening and landscaping or fruit growing companies, forestry or farming enterprises significantly involved in silvicultural activity or 2. At least five years of relevant work in gardening, forestry, wine-growing or agricultural enterprises significantly involved in silvicultural activity or 3. Relevant skills and competences.
Additional information <p>The skills and competences of which proof is to be furnished in the further training examination are usually acquired during many years of practical work and within the framework of education measures. Courses are offered in preparation for the examination; their duration and content are geared to the different specialist and managerial tasks.</p> <p>Translations of the certificate can be obtained from the body mentioned in section 5 above.</p>
