3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Contribute to the content of quotes, particularly with regard to specifying client requirements and requests as well as identifying and justifying the consequent work tasks and formulating the corresponding work assignments; comply with economic efficiency and quality standards; factor in internal production, time and cost planning; obtain and utilize contract-related information; review the preconditions for installation as well as the measurements and structural properties at the building site; comply with relevant rules and regulations; consider technological developments
- Plan, arrange, coordinate and supervise assembly orders, with particular responsibility for advising and problem solving and coordinating contact with clients, employees and site supervisors; ensure contractually agreed services are carried out; handle changes and complaints, propose solutions; coordinate work processes with the trades involved; coordinate decisions with the client; ensure manpower capacity for assembly work; pay attention to quality assurance and comply with relevant occupational health and safety regulations and environmental protection provisions; enable and motivate members of staff to build their assembly skills and arrange for training

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Certified specialist construction managers in joinery typically work for companies in the finishing trades and for producers of builders' joinery and carpentry and finishing components made of wood. They carry out planning and coordination tasks involved in contracting as well as in the delivery, assembly and acceptance of products and provide relevant instruction for staff members.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>The certificate is acquired by passing the examination administered by the body mentioned in Section 5 above. Before sitting the examination, candidates must furnish proof of</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Successful completion of vocational training for the recognized occupation of joiner, followed by at least one year of relevant work experience or 2. Successful completion of vocational training for another recognized occupation in the woodworking or wood processing industries, followed by at least one year of work experience in customer advisory services or 3. Relevant skills and competences
<p>Additional information The skills and competences of which proof is to be furnished in the further training examination are usually acquired during many years of practical work and within the framework of education measures. Courses are offered in preparation for the examination; their duration and content are geared to the different specialist and managerial tasks. Translations of the certificate can be obtained from the body mentioned in Section 5 above.</p>
