<p>Certified restorers in the different trades work in craft trade and restoration businesses and in government and private institutions.</p> <p>The profile of skills and competencies in the area of craft trade restoration covers the following craft trades: bookbinder, gold and silversmith, engraver, wood sculptor, motor vehicle body and vehicle construction mechanic, vehicle mechanic, painter and varnisher, mason and concrete worker, metal worker, decorative metal worker, organ and harmonium builder, parquet layer, interior decorator, stonemason and sculptor, stuccoist, joiner, watchmaker, gilder and carpenter.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>The advanced vocational education and training is obtained by passing an examination before the competent body specified under 5. Those who provide evidence of the following may be admitted to the examination:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Those who can provide evidence of a successfully completed master craftsman examination in the relevant craft trade and who have at least one year of professional practical experience in the craft trade are to be admitted to the examination for the recognised advanced vocational qualification in one of the craft trades under Section 2 2. Notwithstanding Paragraph 1, those who by means of presentation of certificates or by other means provide satisfactory evidence that they have acquired the skills, knowledge and competencies justifying admission to the examination, must also be admitted to the examination. 	
Additional information The skills and competences of which proof is to be furnished in the further training examination are usually acquired during many years of practical work and within the framework of education measures. Courses are offered in preparation for the examination; their duration and content are geared to the different specialist and managerial tasks. The successful candidate passing the examination has acquired the qualifications required to provide training within the meaning of Section 30(5) of the Vocational Training Act.
