3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Lay ready manufactured parquet flooring and laminated materials
- Check floor conditions prior to laying
- Prepare undersurfaces for the laying of textile and flexible floor coverings, ready manufactured parquet flooring and laminated materials
- Create undersurfaces
- Design and lay textile and flexible floor coverings
- Treat the surfaces of cork flooring and other floor coverings
- Make, process and install profiles
- Maintain and carry out routine repairs to textile and flexible floor coverings, ready manufactured parquet flooring and laminated materials
- Check the quality of work for any errors in execution and document work
- Carry out quality assurance measures and charge for services provided
- Operate and maintain equipment and machines
- Conduct measurements and document results
- Select and set up equipment and machines and carry out maintenance work
- Process wood, wood materials, plastics and metals manually and by machine
- Work autonomously and in a customer oriented way either alone or in conjunction with other trades to execute works on the basis of technical documentation and work orders
- Plan and coordinate work
- Set up workplaces and initiate safety, health and safety at work and environmental protection measures.

Floor layers work in particular for floor laying companies, craft trade companies specialising in interior decoration and for any firm providing services in this area, such as interior decoration departments in large stores and in specialist floor covering or interior decorating shops.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Final examination administered by the competent body:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. after completion of dual training in a company and at part-time vocational school (normal procedure) 2. after retraining in a recognized training occupation 3. as an external examination for working people without formal vocational qualifications or persons who have been trained at full-time vocational schools or other vocational training institutions
<p>Additional information</p> <p>Entry requirements: Entry requirements are not governed by legislation; as a rule, young people are admitted after completing (nine or ten years of) general education.</p> <p>Duration of training: 3 years.</p> <p>Training in the "dual system": Teaching of the knowledge, skills and competences needed for an occupation is based on the typical requirements of work and business processes and prepares the trainees for a specific job. The training is provided in a company and at part-time vocational school: In the company, the trainees acquire practical skills in a real working environment.
