3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Install electrical systems for lighting, power supply distribution and control of electrical equipment and machines
- Set up and install switchgear assemblies and distribution boards
- Assemble switchgear and wire up electrical sub-assemblies
- Plan orders and prepare the sequence of order processing
- Set up and decommission assembly construction sites
- Process and connect mechanical parts
- Install wiring systems
- Lay and connect wiring
- Measure, test, adjust and commission electrical equipment and assemblies
- Rectify faults in electrical systems
- Document circuit diagrams, materials, spares and technical tests
- Work in an autonomous manner on the basis of documentation and instructions and according due consideration to relevant regulations and safety provisions
- Carry out work in the capacity of skilled electrical and electronic engineering workers under the provisions of the Prevention of Accidents Regulations.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (1)

Electronic systems fitters (m/f) are involved in the assembly and installation of electricity supply, control engineering, signalling and lighting systems.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Final examination administered by the competent body:

1. after completion of dual training in a company and at part-time vocational school (normal procedure)
2. after retraining in a recognized training occupation
3. as an external examination for working people without formal vocational qualifications or persons who have been trained at full-time vocational schools or other vocational training institutions

Additional information

Entry requirements: Entry requirements are not governed by legislation; as a rule, young people are admitted after completing (nine or ten years of) general education.

Duration of training: 3 years.

Training in the "dual system":

Teaching of the knowledge, skills and competences needed for an occupation is based on the typical requirements of work and business processes and prepares the trainees for a specific job. **The training is provided in a company and at part-time vocational school:** In the company, the trainees acquire practical skills in a real working environment. On one or two days per week, the trainees attend part-time vocational school, where they are taught general and vocational knowledge related to their training occupation.
