3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Plan, organize and supervise the processes of confectionery manufacture, taking account of the specific requirements of raw materials as well as economic and ecological aspects,
- Ensure compliance with regulations governing occupational safety, environmental and health protection, and food safety,
- Establish quality requirements as a part of quality management and ensure compliance,
- Establish quantity requirements and ensure compliance,
- Implement measures to prevent and remedy breakdowns; meet maintenance requirements,
- Organize and supervise the commissioning and decommissioning of processing, manufacturing and packaging equipment while giving due attention to food safety,
- Utilize planning, control and communication systems,
- Cooperate in the development, planning and implementation of new confectionery technology approaches,
- Design the process of steady improvement,
- Steer cost development and cost-effective operation,
- Perform personnel management functions,
- Plan, organize and implement training and instruction for staff,
- Prepare, organize, implement and complete training.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Certified industrial supervisors specializing in confectionery work as senior-level staff in confectionery companies, particularly in the manufacture of chocolate goods, sweets, fine pastries, snack items and ice cream. They are responsible for solving complex planning, managerial, organizational and supervisory tasks independently, using instruments of operations control and human resources management.

Legal basis

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

The certificate is acquired through passing the examination administered by the body mentioned in section 5 above. Before sitting the examination, candidates must furnish proof of

1. Successful completion of vocational training for the recognized occupation of technologist in confectionery goods (*Süßwarentechnologe/ Süßwarentechnologin*) and at least one year of relevant work experience or
2. Successful completion of a final or journeyman's examination in a recognized training occupation in the food sector followed by at least 18 months of relevant work experience or
3. Successful completion of a final or journeyman's examination in another recognized training occupation followed by at least two years of relevant work experience or
4. At least five years of relevant work experience or
5. Relevant skills and competences and the
6. Acquisition of training skills.

Additional information

The skills and competences of which proof is to be furnished in the further training examination are usually acquired during many years of practical work and within the framework of education measures. Courses are offered in preparation for the examination; their duration and content are geared to the different specialist and managerial tasks.

The successful candidate passing the examination has acquired the qualifications required to provide training within the meaning of Section 30(5) of the Vocational Training Act.
