- Prepare finishings and foot beds for ready-to-wear shoes
- Prepare model designs for custom shoes
- Select and use leather and other work and auxiliary materials in accordance with their intended purpose and cost-effectiveness
- Prepare technical documentation and specify work processes
- Measure feet and prepare footprints
- Cut, process and prepare the parts for the base of the shoe
- Join uppers and bottoms to made-to-measure shoes
- Use knowledge of the anatomy of the support and locomotor systems
- Support and advise clients
- Sell shoes, shoe accessories and services
- Assess product quality and carry out quality assurance measures
- Comply with measures relating to sustainability, environmental protection, safety and health and safety at work.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (1)

Custom shoemakers specialising in custom shoes manufacture individual made-to-measure shoes, make alterations to ready-to-wear shoes in accordance with customer wishes and carry out repair and alteration works to both custom and off-the-rack shoes. They may, for example, be employed in shoe making and custom shoe manufacturing workshops in the craft trade sector, at industrial shoe manufacturing companies or at theatres.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Final examination administered by the competent body:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. after completion of dual training in a company and at part-time vocational school (normal procedure) 2. after retraining in a recognized training occupation 3. as an external examination for working people without formal vocational qualifications or persons who have been trained at full-time vocational schools or other vocational training institutions
<p>Additional information</p> <p>Entry requirements: Entry requirements are not governed by legislation; as a rule, young people are admitted after completing (nine or ten years of) general education.</p> <p>Duration of training: 3 years.</p> <p>Training in the "dual system": Teaching of the knowledge, skills and competences needed for an occupation is based on the typical requirements of work and business processes and prepares the trainees for a specific job. The training is provided in a company and at part-time vocational school: In the company, the trainees acquire practical skills in a real working environment.
