3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Manufacture of garments and textile goods due account of commercial considerations and fashion trends
- Select textile work materials, auxiliary materials and accessories with reference to intended purpose and economic efficiency
- Develop documentation for the pre-production and production stages and calculate manufacturing costs
- Set up, operate and monitor machinery and plants and apply a range of manufacturing technologies in the cutting, pressing, sewing and quality control stages of production according due consideration to health and safety at work
- Use production data acquisition and evaluation systems and electronically controlled equipment in machinery and plants
- Understand the correlation between design, construction and manufacture
- Conduct technical modelling works and prepare cross-section drawings
- Produce models for clothing collections and high-volume production taking due account of fashion trends and commercial considerations
- Monitor the production process and carry out final inspection
- Assess quality and initiate quality assurance measures.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (1)

Apparel tailors are employed in sewing departments and pattern workshops, predominantly in the manufacture of clothing collections and high-volume production. They work for companies involved in the manufacture of ladies', gentlemen's and children's outerwear, occupational, sport and leisure clothing, lingerie, bathing clothing and corsetry, head wear, clothing accessories and textiles for house and home.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Final examination administered by the competent body:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. after completion of dual training in a company and at part-time vocational school (normal procedure) 2. after retraining in a recognized training occupation 3. as an external examination for working people without formal vocational qualifications or persons who have been trained at full-time vocational schools or other vocational training institutions
<p>Additional information</p> <p>Entry requirements: Entry requirements are not governed by legislation; as a rule, young people are admitted after completing (nine or ten years of) general education.</p> <p>Duration of training: 3 years.</p> <p>Training in the "dual system": Teaching of the knowledge, skills and competences needed for an occupation is based on the typical requirements of work and business processes and prepares the trainees for a specific job. The training is provided in a company and at part-time vocational school: In the company, the trainees acquire practical skills in a real working environment.
