3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Manufacture toy figures, fabric toys and wooden toys
- Select and process textiles, auxiliary materials, wood and derived timber products and plastics on the basis of intended use and economic considerations
- Prepare documents for the production procedure and technical data on work flows and record results
- Set up, operate, monitor and maintain tools, machinery and plants
- Prepare and evaluate sketches and drawings
- Prepare cutting stencils, blanks and plastic parts according due consideration to rational use of materials
- Apply a range of surface treatment processes
- Connect components together into sub-assemblies and finished products and carry out final assembly, e.g. sew dolls' clothes and outer fur-fabric shells and join body parts and components
- Decorate and finish products, e.g. dress, arrange hair and paint the faces of dolls
- Carry out quality checks and initiate quality assurance measures, pack products decoratively
- Carry out duties independently working from technical documentation
- Accord due consideration to the basic principles of environmental protection, safety and health and safety at work.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (1)

Toy makers work for companies within the toy making industry. Depending upon the production division in which they work, they manufacture toy figures, fabric toys and wooden toys, e.g. dolls, soft toys, doll's house furniture, plush rings, wooden vehicles and model railway accessories. Their field of activity also extends to encompass organisational duties relating to operations planning and production.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Final examination administered by the competent body: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. after completion of dual training in a company and at part-time vocational school (normal procedure) 2. after retraining in a recognized training occupation 3. as an external examination for working people without formal vocational qualifications or persons who have been trained at full-time vocational schools or other vocational training institutions
Additional information Entry requirements: Entry requirements are not governed by legislation; as a rule, young people are admitted after completing (nine or ten years of) general education. Duration of training: 3 years. Training in the "dual system": Teaching of the knowledge, skills and competences needed for an occupation is based on the typical requirements of work and business processes and prepares the trainees for a specific job. The training is provided in a company and at part-time vocational school: In the company, the trainees acquire practical skills in a real working environment. On one or two days per week, the trainees attend part-time vocational school, where they are taught general and vocational knowledge related to their training occupation.
