3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- Produce and market honey, wax and other bee products according due consideration to trade-specific regulations and quality standards
- Implement and document measures for compliance with hygiene regulations in the manufacture and marketing of bee products
- Breed, keep and market queen bees
- Feed and keep animals using farm-specific systems and methods
- Clean, disinfect and maintain animal accommodation
- Conduct preventive health measures and care for sick animals following veterinary instructions and according due consideration to hygiene specifications
- Assess bee populations before overwintering begins, or at the end of overwintering, and systematically conduct the necessary measures
- Assess swarming behaviour and apply methods to prevent swarming
- Develop and maintain young populations
- Conduct bee migrations and pollination tasks
- Plan and document work, specify working steps, take measures to protect safety and health and safety at work, monitor and evaluate work results
- Carry out quality assurance measures
- Use communication and information technologies both internally within the company and when dealing with customers
- Use machines, devices and operating materials, make use of operating facilities
- Manage, maintain and repair machines, devices and operating facilities.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (1)

Animal caretakers specialising in apiculture work in farming operations, in particular on beekeeping farms, in associations and institutions, in agricultural training institutes, in specialist beekeeping trade operations, in honey and wax processing operations, in queen breeding and pollination operations, and for market traders.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Final examination administered by the competent body:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. after completion of dual training in a company and at part-time vocational school (normal procedure) 2. after retraining in a recognized training occupation 3. as an external examination for working people without formal vocational qualifications or persons who have been trained at full-time vocational schools or other vocational training institutions
<p>Additional information</p> <p>Entry requirements: Entry requirements are not governed by legislation; as a rule, young people are admitted after completing (nine or ten years of) general education.</p> <p>Duration of training: 3 years.</p> <p>Training in the "dual system": The knowledge, skills and competences delivered in a training occupation are based on the typical requirements of work processes and prepare the trainees for a specific job as well as for further qualifications. The training is provided in a company and at vocational school: Trainees spend 75% of the duration of training in the company. Here they acquire practical skills in a real working environment.
