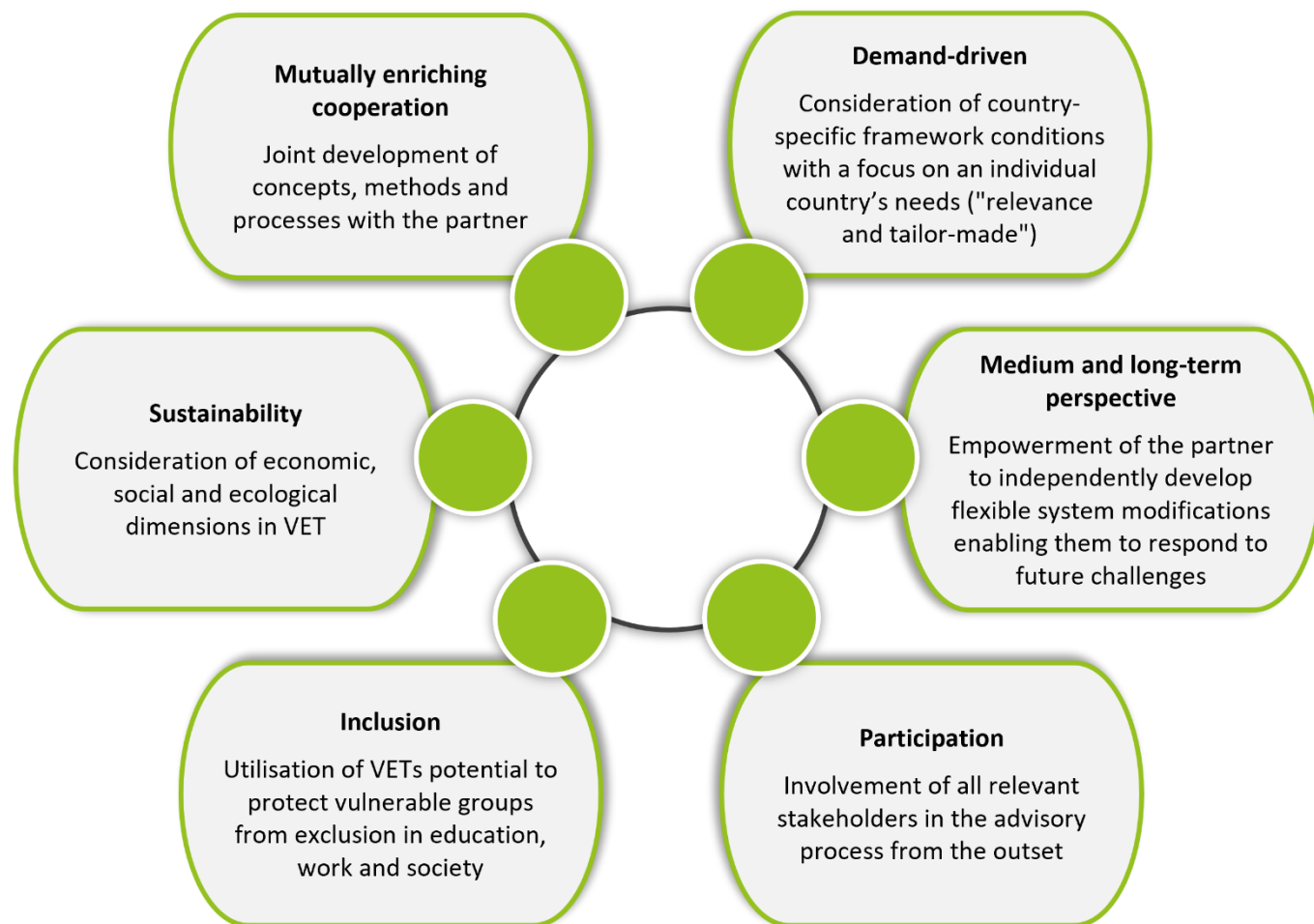

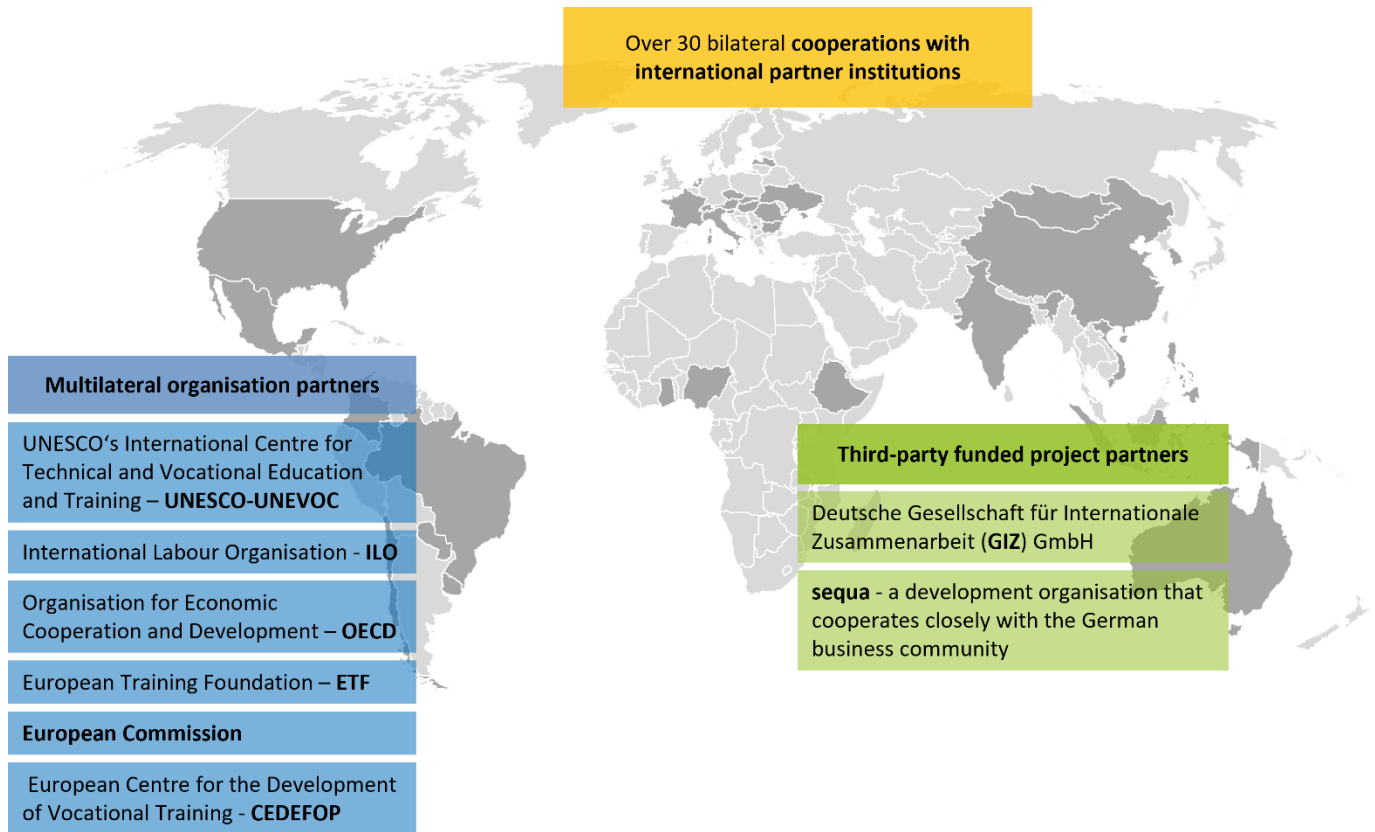

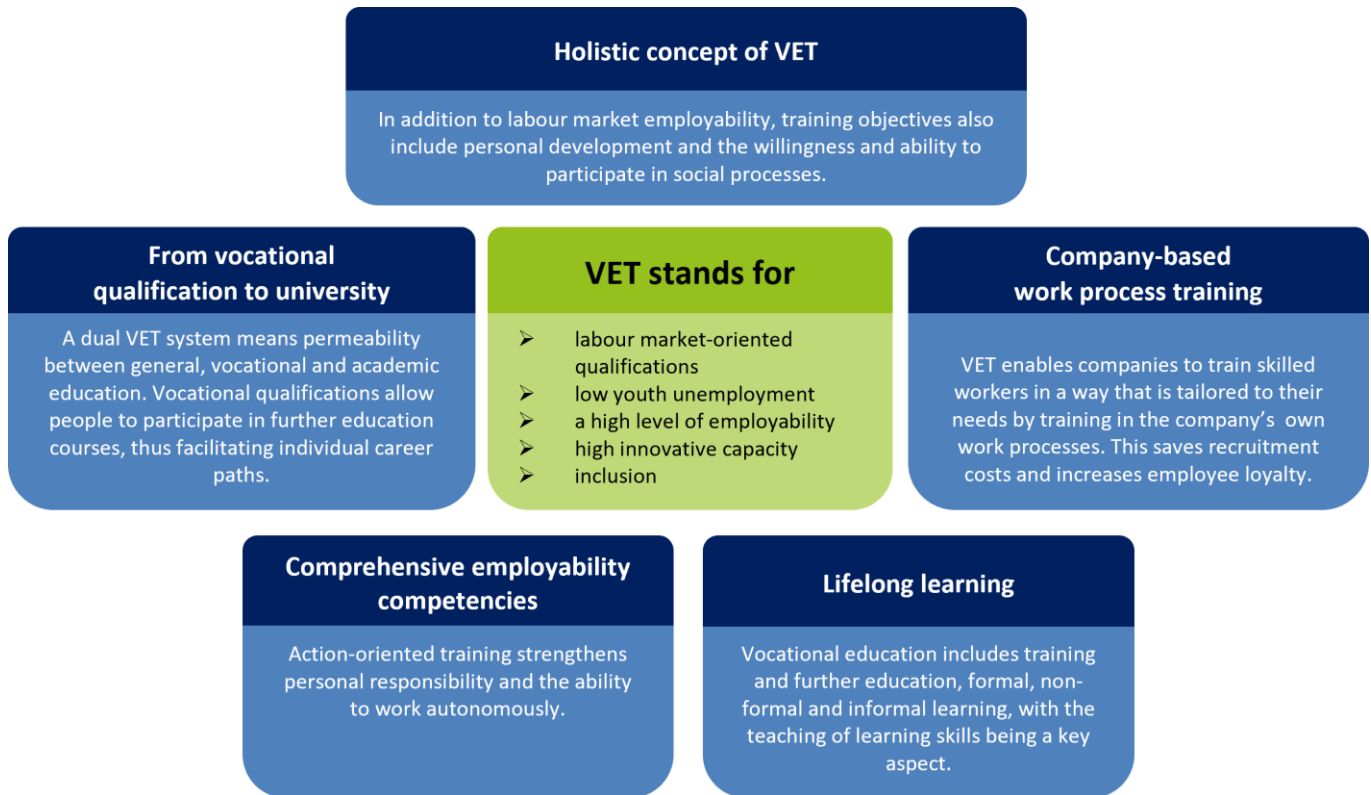

Dual VET - A Win-win Situation for Young People, Companies, and Society



Dual VET involves two learning venues: companies (70%) and vocational schools (30%). Germany is one of the leading countries when it comes to dual VET:

- > 50% of the German population embark on a dual VET learning pathway at some point in their lives. Thanks to dual VET, a wide range of career paths is open to them.
- 72% of the apprentices are employed by the company upon completion of their training.
- 19% of the German companies train dual apprentices. This is how they educate their specialists according to their company's own needs.
