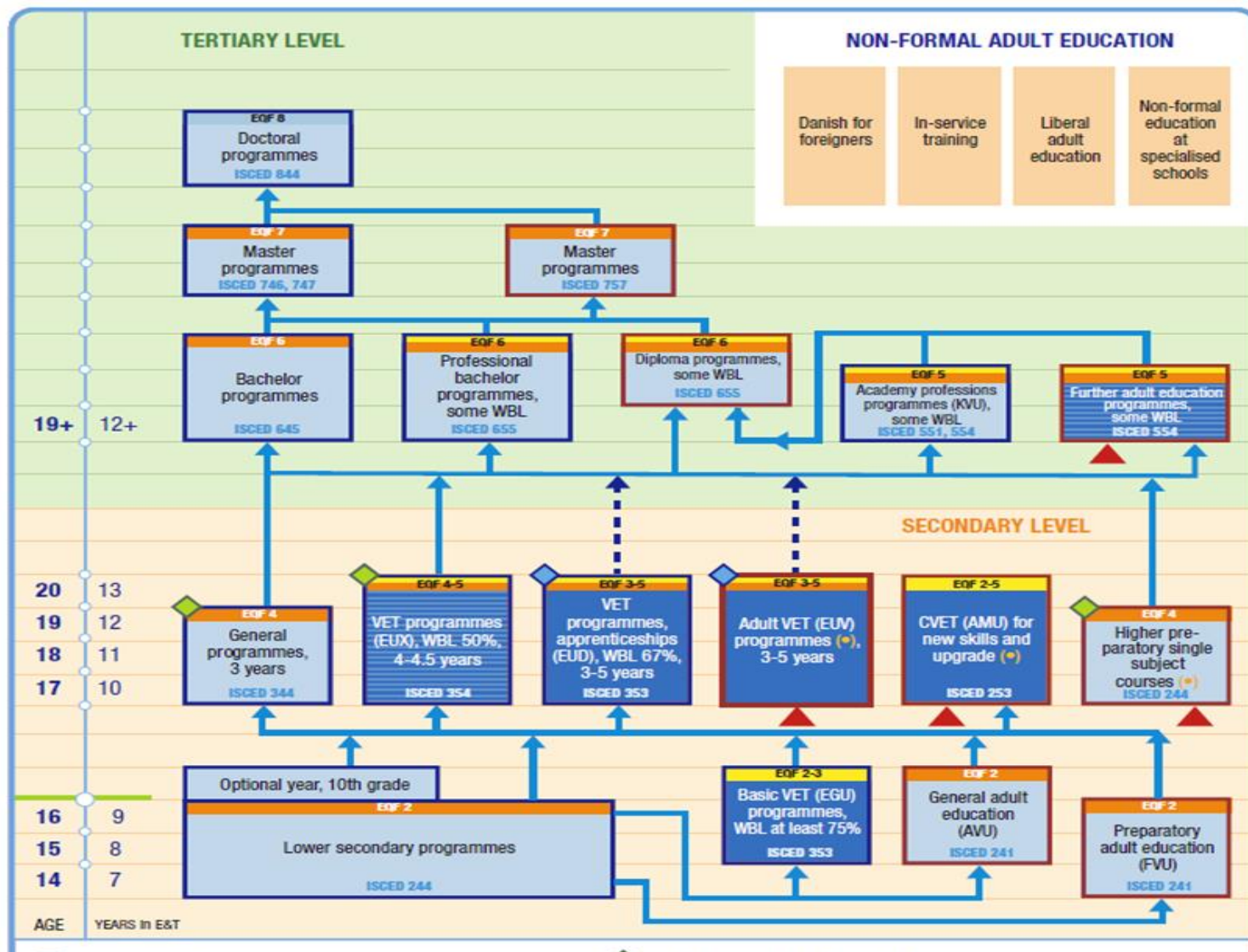

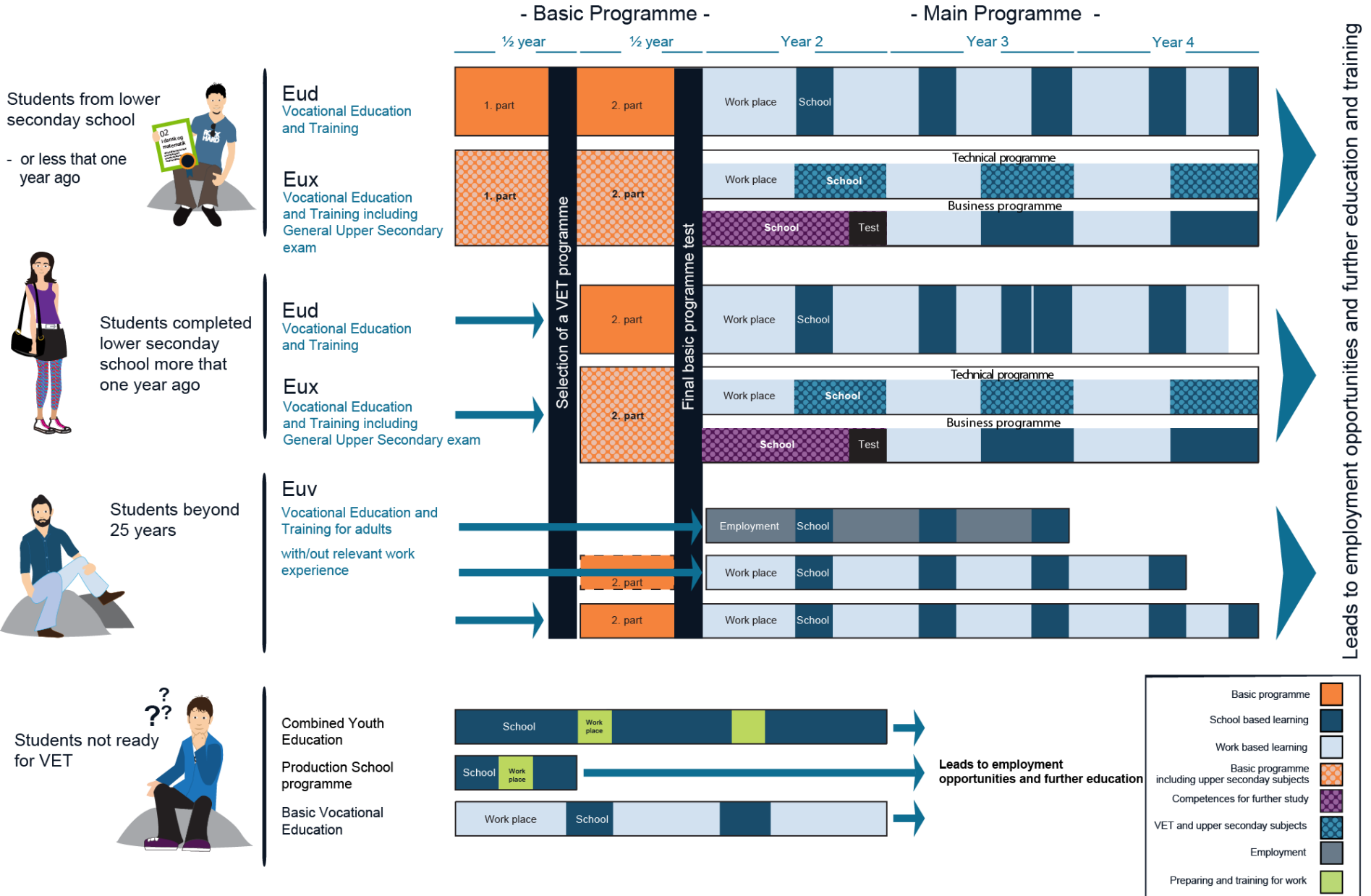

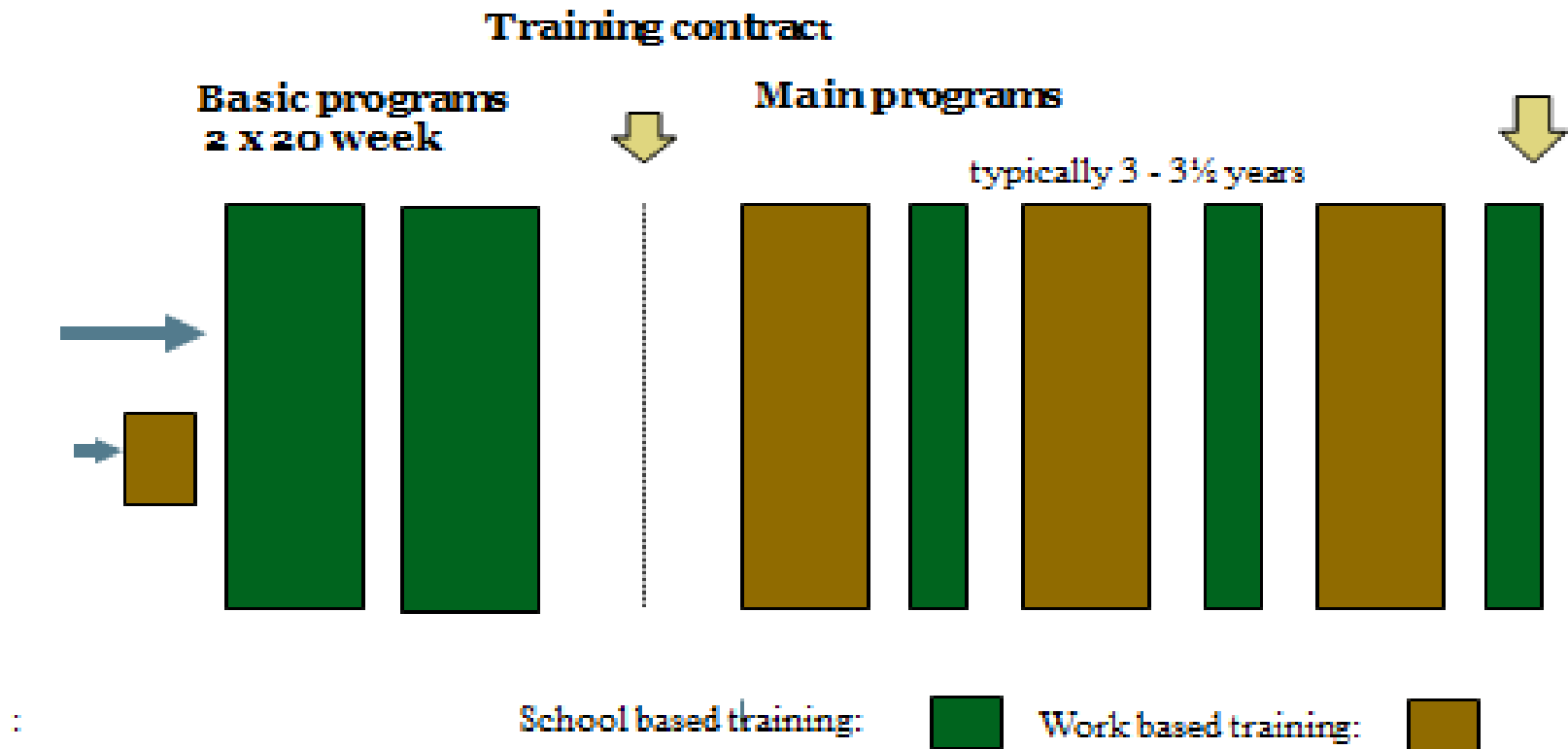

The dual principle in Danish VET



Basic and Main programmes

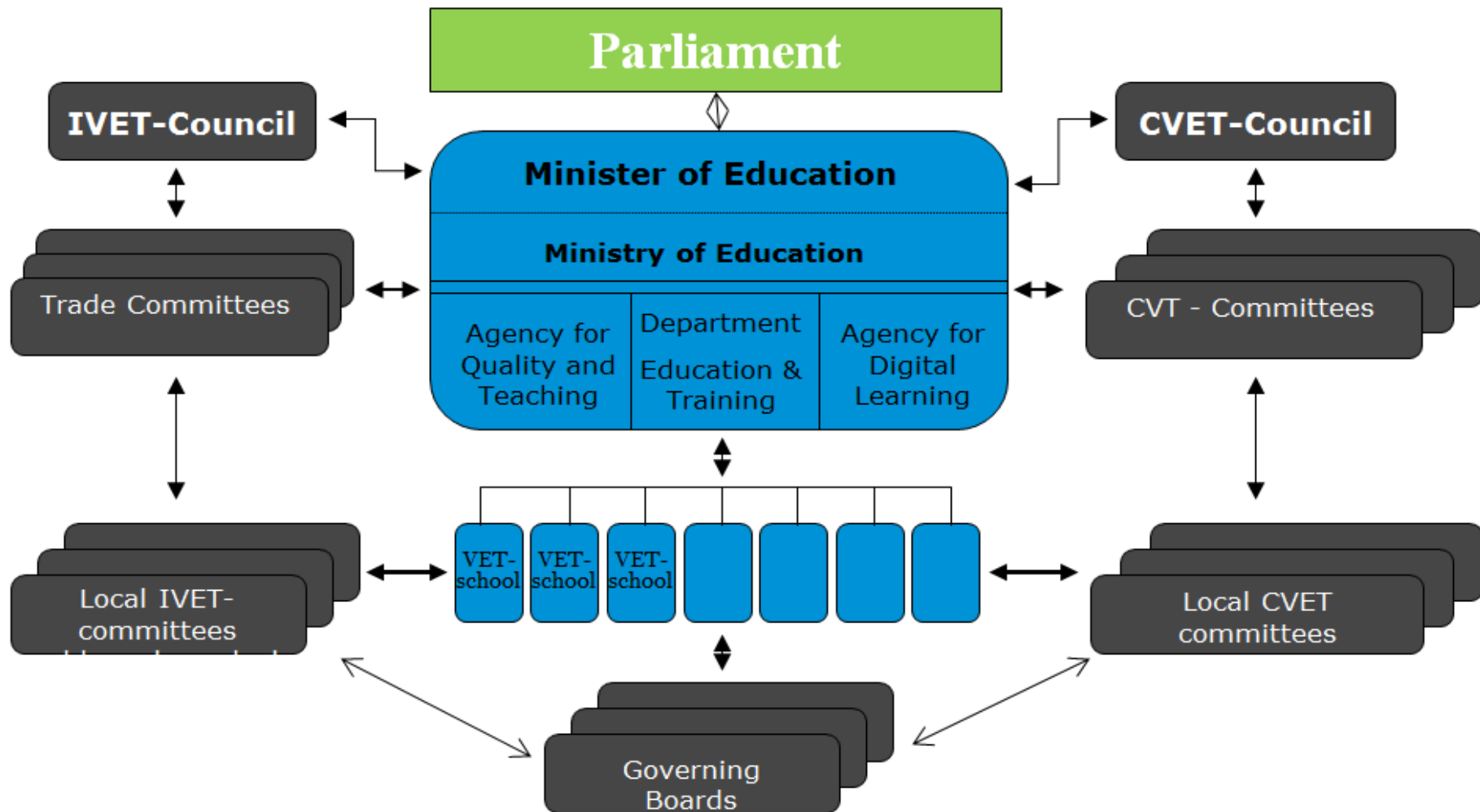
Basic programmes:

- Care, health and pedagogy
- Office, trade and business services
- Food, agriculture and experiences
- Technology, construction and transportation

Main programmes:

- 106 different main programmes with 300 specialisations

Governance and Stakeholder Cooperation in the Danish VET-system



Learning in companies

Company

- All companies approved by the Trade committee can recruit apprentices
- Appropriate and adequate facilities and qualified trainers available
- Legal basis for the apprenticeship is a contract signed by apprentice and the employer and registered at the VET college.

The learner

- Salary according to the collective agreement and is entitled to vacation and must take part in the school periods
- The apprentice is considered a learner, but it is expected he/she learn through the contribution to productive work

Centres of Placements

- Introduction of Centres of Placements in 2013 - For student who are not able to get a contract with a company
- Main aim of the centres is to minimize the training in the centre and to ensure training takes place in companies
- The centres are responsible for organisazing training and that it covers the learning outcome as specified in the curriculum for the practical part of the VET programme
